The pavilion outside The Highland Center is used every day during the warmer months of the year; it shelters the Highland Farmers' Market, provides a nice place to eat lunch, and offers space for outdoor workshops, parties, and reunions.

The raised beds next to the pavilion were put in place many years ago and are now in need of some extra care and attention. The Highland Center is thrilled to partner with the Highland Extension Office to revitalize the garden beds and to offer educational and volunteer opportunities for kids and adults alike through the planting and and tending of the garden beds throughout the year.

The Highland Center and Extension Office are currently soliciting donations to help purchase the necessary construction materials, seeds, and educational materials. Our goal is to raise at least \$1,000 by April 1st so that supplies can be purchased and a ribbon cutting and donor recognition ceremony can take place at the first Farmers' Market of the season.

Youth Philanthropy Council



The Youth Philanthropy Council is an educational program of the Community Foundation of the Central Blue Ridge that is led and facilitated here in Highland County by The Highland Center.

The Youth Philanthropy Council is comprised of student volunteers from Highland High School who learn about the importance of philanthropy and how to investigate causes and organizations that they may wish to support. This year, ten teens from all high school grade levels are participating in the program.

In February, students will agree on their funding priorities for 2024 and a grant application will be made available to nonprofits serving Highland County. The council members will then take on the task of reading and evaluating each grant application as they decide how to allocate \$10,000 in grant money.

The Youth Philanthropy Council plans to award the 2024 grant funding at a ceremony at The Highland Center later this spring. We will share details as they are available and hope that you will come out to support our youth philanthropists and the wonderful nonprofits working to make Highland County even better.
